Robert "Bob" Pascoe spent many years on the NSJTA committee, serving as Vice President and leading the coordination of team events. Bob generously gave his time to support these events, often accompanying our teams on trips to Adelaide and other locations, creating incredible opportunities for young players to experience competitive tennis.

Sadly, Bob has passed away, but his contributions and spirit live on.

His wife, Leanne, shared these touching words:

"Rob was so proud of all the kids he took to the team events. He felt so privileged to be involved and couldn't wait for the events to happen. Even leading up to the events, he was always checking that the kids were okay to play and encouraging them at team practice. He really just loved being around kids and tennis."

"During the events, he couldn't stay still. He would always say to me, 'Lee, I haven't got time to talk — I have to go watch.' He didn't want to miss anyone playing. He was always willing to help anyone and made sure everyone had a great time, win or lose. He constantly encouraged the kids and reminded them to be honest and fair players. He was so proud of everyone at the events."

The annual awarding of the **Bob Pascoe Shield** at this event honours Bob's dedication, passion, and the countless hours he gave to the NSJTA. We continue to uphold the values he stood for — commitment, sportsmanship, and teamwork.

.State Team Championships - Pat Cash Cup 2025

2025 Victorian State Team Championships

Saturday 29th & Sunday 30th March 2025 – Horsham Lawn Tennis Club

The 2025 Tennis Victoria State Teams Championships, featuring the prestigious Pat Cash Cup, took place on March 29–30 at the Horsham Lawn Tennis Club.

This premier junior team tennis event brought together top young players from across Victoria, competing in the 12/U, 14/U, and Junior Open divisions for both boys and girls. The championships followed a round-robin format, culminating in finals that determined the best-performing regional teams. The overall winner of the event was awarded the Pat Cash Cup, named in honour of the renowned Victorian tennis legend.

The 2025 championships marked the second year of a three-year agreement between Tennis Victoria and the Horsham Rural City Council to host this significant event in the Wimmera region.

Bayside Regional emerged as the overall winner, accumulating 188 points and narrowly edging out our team, which finished a close second with 186 points — what an outstanding effort!

Player Profile



Player Profile Spotlight: Xavier Gowland

Each edition of our newsletter will feature a snapshot of select players within the NSJTA. Our first player profile highlights **Xavier Gowland**, who has been an integral part of NSJTA teams in recent years and has demonstrated outstanding leadership qualities.

Xavier was the recipient of the 2024 **Bob Pascoe Shield** (see below) awarded at the Pat Pearce Shield. This accolade recognises a player within the NSJTA who not only achieves on-court success during the event but also exemplifies exceptional leadership, attitude, and sportsmanship.

We had the opportunity to ask Xavier a few questions for this inaugural profile:

What club do you play for and train at?

I play for Coburg Tennis Club and began my career at Strathmore Tennis Club. I primarily train at Maribyrnong College with MITS and Maribyrnong Sports Academy, but I also regularly practice at both Strathmore and Coburg.

Who is your current coach?

My current coach is Jordan Wright, who has been coaching me for the past six years.

Who has been your biggest inspiration in tennis so far?

My biggest inspiration has been Roger Federer; I've always admired his style and approach to the game. Currently, I look up to Alex De Minaur for his exceptional movement and his determination on court.

What is your favourite shot to play?

I love executing a great drop shot, but my favourite shot would have to be my off forehand. It's a strong weapon in my game.

What has been your biggest challenge in tennis to date?

I've faced several challenges, including injuries, but the hardest part has been maintaining the hard work. It's tough when you're fatigued, but after pushing through, you feel a great sense of accomplishment the next time you step on court.

Can you describe your training routine?

I train approximately 11 hours per week on court. The first half of the week is dedicated to volume training, while the latter half focuses on point play, including pressure situations and match fitness through playing sets.

How do you handle high-pressure situations during a match?

In high-pressure moments, I like to play with more margin — hitting higher over the net and aiming towards the centre rather than close to the lines. I also focus on playing higher-percentage shots to reduce errors.

Do you have any short-term goals you'd like to achieve in the coming months or years?

In the next few months, I plan to compete in ITF tournaments in Australia to elevate my level of play. Additionally, I aim to achieve a ranking by the end of the year and reach around the 10 UTR mark.

Do you have any hobbies or interests outside of tennis?

Outside tennis, I am a big footy fan. I enjoyed playing growing up but had to focus on tennis after injuries. This year, I'm hoping Essendon finally secures a finals win. (Editor's note: Amen to that! #Dons2025!)

What's the best part about representing NSJTA in events?

Representing NSJTA is a privilege. The team atmosphere, both on and off the court, is incredible. Although tennis is an individual sport, being part of the team adds a unique energy and support. Even if you lose a match, the team spirit continues, and there's always a chance for redemption in subsequent matches. I hope to have the privilege of representing NSJTA many more times.
